

CHILDREN and HAND SANITIZER

Intentional Misuse

THE ISSUE

Recently, the Georgia Poison
Center and Georgia Emergency
Rooms have noticed a troubling
new trend—children drinking hand
sanitizer.

THE FACTS

- Most hand sanitizers contain more than 60% ethyl alcohol (ethanol) more than most hard liquors
- Drinking ethanol-based hand sanitizers can cause alcohol poisoning
- Over the past 5 years, the nation's poison control centers have experienced close to 85,000 reported hand sanitizer calls to children.

THE SYMPTOMS

Alcohol poisoning is dangerous!

- Confusion
- Vomiting
- Drowsiness
- Slow or Irregular Breathing
- Blue-tinged or Pale Skin
- Low Body Temperature
- Low Blood Sugars

THE ACTIONS

- Keep hand sanitizer stored out of the reach and sight of children
- Children should be under careful adult supervision when using it
- Consider using non-alcohol based products and wipes
